## Will war help the U.S. people?

- ◆ War puts U.S. service people at risk of death and injury; up to 1/3 of Persian Gulf War veterans have service related medical problems. (An April 2000 Veterans Administration fact sheet said that VA had *approved* more than 183,037 claims for service injuries or illnesses out of 695,516 military personnel who served in the Gulf.)
- ◆ War puts service personnel at risk of exposure to toxic chemicals from both sides, and to untested vaccines.
- ◆ War diverts money needed for health care and education to weapons; war hurts everyone.
- ◆ War would increase the chance of terrorist attacks on the U.S. An AP poll released Dec. 30, 2002, says two-thirds of the people in the U.S. agree.
- ◆ A preemptive attack sends the message that it's okay for nations to attack one another, including attacks on the U.S.

## Will war help the Iraqi people?

- ◆ War would kill many civilians, perhaps 100,000 as in 1991.
- ◆ If Iraq does have biological, chemical or nuclear weapons, U.S. strikes could create an environmental disaster. In addition, war could incite Saddam Hussein to use these weapons. CIA Director George Tenet wrote in Oct. 2002, that Saddam Hussein was unlikely to use chemical or biological weapons *unless attacked*.
- ◆ War could create a humanitarian disaster with millions of refugees facing starvation.
- ◆ A regime change could mean an even worse, more repressive government in Iraq.
